In *Philippians 3*, the apostle Paul uses athletic terms to describe our journey of faith. He compared the Christian life to a race and admitted that he had not yet arrived at the finish line. He wrote in *Philippians 3:13-14*, "*Brethren, I count not* myself to have apprehended: but this one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind, and reaching forth unto those things which are before, I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus. We are thankful for the Lord's guidance, protection, and safety in the many miles traveled and the wonderful responses to the Lord and His calling.

I am excited for my upcoming trip to Papua New Guinea and Australia this May. I will be preaching, teaching, and serving our national pastors and people there. The "Building Papua New Guinea" project has grown to \$30,000 thus far. All funds raised have been and will continue to be used for the building of classrooms for Shalom Baptist Church, the Bible institute connected with Shalom Baptist Church, and Shalom Christian Academy in Port Moresby. A health clinic to be operated as a ministry outreach will also be constructed with funds raised for this project. Lord willing, our goal, the "mark" we are striving for, is to raise an additional \$70,000 for the completion of this building project. "Thank You" to all who have given to this project. Hebrews 12:1-2 reads, "Wherefore seeing we also are compassed about with so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and sin which doth so easily beset us, and let us run with patience the race that is set before us, Looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of our faith; who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the same, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God." May we never call it quits in pursing Jesus.
